Developing proprietary methodologies meant shifting from applying frameworks to constructing them, adopting the mindset of a system designer.

In this transition, technology ceased to be a support function and became active project material, shaping how organisations learn and evolve.

The founding of Sky Walker marked an irreversible step into entrepreneurship grounded in a clear thesis on technology, work, and human wellbeing.

At that stage, technology became inseparable from business evolution, as artificial intelligence and automation redefine competence and decision-making.

The shift to an innovative startup introduced economic and administrative discontinuities that innovation narratives rarely make visible.

“Don’t Panic.”

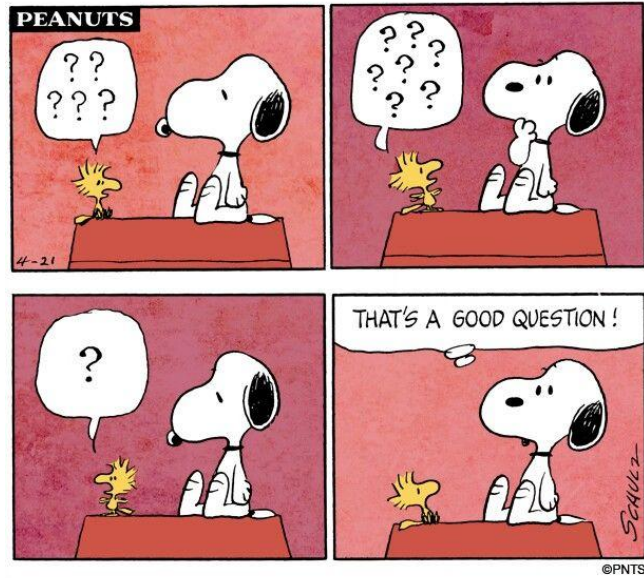
